


# **The 1848 Revolutions**

The 1848 Revolutions, written by Peter Jones, is part of a large series of books collectively entitled "Seminar Studies in History." The 1848 Revolutions, Second Edition, was first published in 1991 by the Longman Group UK Limited; this book focuses on a number of revolutions that took place in Europe in 1848, with France at the epicenter of the disturbance. The book explores the course of the revolutions in four primary regions during this time: France, the Habsburg lands, the German lands, and the Italian peninsula, as well as the causes of those revolutions. This book is a very comprehensive study of the revolutions of 1848, and the author effectively presents and analyzes information derived from primary sources and statistics from the time period in question. As such, The 1848 Revolutions is an excellent reference book for the individuals, events, and causes of the Europe-wide revolutions of 1848, though insignificant flaws do exist in the writing. In this book, Peter Jones describes and intensely studies the revolutions that occurred in France, the Habsburg lands, the German lands, and the Italian peninsula during the year 1848. Jones scrutinizes the underlying

as well as specific reasons why the revolutions took place, in addition to examining the reasons for the spread of these revolutions. Jones focuses on the political, social, and economic conditions that instigated the revolutionary changes of 1848.
