

I think previous reviewers Scott Henson (5 stars) and Jessica L. Krudwig (3 stars) pretty much nailed it with their reviews (though for the star count, I'm going with Jessica, giving 3 stars).My summation:1) If you want to understand why Mexico or Mexicans do what they do (and don't do what they don't do), this book is part of the standard-issue reading list. I wouldn't consider it anywhere near the be-all-end-all, but with how often it is referenced, it needs to be part of the mix.2) Mexico, America, and the rest of the world have changed a lot since this book was written. It seems to me that some of it is dated. Yet, in all fairness, some of it seems proven true (e.g. much of the criticism of USA capitalism and commercialism running amok &/or being soulless). I don't think cultures change overnight, or even in only one or two generations, but the worldview gazed through

for the writing of this book isn't as tenable, now days.3) The writing is what one would expect from a poet. Overstuffed with allusions and flowery prose, the core message/meaning of the author can get lost in the verbiage, at times. That shouldn't prevent you from reading it, and in itself it is something of an example of "Mexican thinking/speaking." I mention it to warn you that there are many words to digest to get down to a succinct chunk of useful information/opinion.4) I would suggest reading some Mexican history before reading this book. He covers many centuries when critiquing El Mexicano and if you have a better understanding of a more "objective" history of Mexico it is easier to grasp the opinions and conclusions he builds on top of Mexico's historical events.
